Overview

We are reviewing all Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs) across Buckinghamshire.

We want to hear your views on our proposals to:

- expire the existing Chiltern Car Parks Public Spaces Protection Order, introduced by Chiltern District Council
- introduce a new Buckinghamshire Council, Buckinghamshire Car Parks Public Space Protection Order

We have a key role to play in helping make local places safe to live, visit and work in. Tackling anti-social behaviour continues to be a high priority for us and our partners across the county.

Public Spaces Protection Orders are aimed at ensuring public spaces can be enjoyed free from anti-social behaviour. They provide us with legal powers to deal with a particular nuisance or problem in a defined area.

It is key that we address and reduce these issues from occurring, by consulting with members of the public and other key stakeholders, in order to focus on areas of concern.

We want to hear from residents and organisations in Buckinghamshire as well as those who use the car parks in Buckinghamshire.

Information about Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs):

What is a PSPO?

Public Spaces Protection Orders (PSPOs) are intended to deal with a particular nuisance or problem in a specific area that is detrimental to the local community's quality of life, by imposing conditions on the use of that area, which apply to everyone.

Councils can use PSPOs to prohibit specified activities, and / or require certain things to be done by people engaged in particular activities, within a defined public area.

A single PSPO can be used to target a range of different anti-social behaviour issues.

A PSPO can last for up to three years, after which it must be reviewed.

What can PSPOs be used for?

PSPOs can be used to restrict a broad range of activities.

Under section 59 of the Anti-Social Behaviour, Crime and Policing Act 2014, local authorities must be satisfied on reasonable grounds that the activity subject to an Order:

- has a detrimental effect on the quality of life of those in the locality (or it
 is likely that activities will take place and have such an effect)
- is (or is likely to be) persistent or continuing in nature
- is (or is likely to be) unreasonable
- justifies the restrictions being imposed.

How are PSPOs enforced?

Authorised officers from Buckinghamshire Council and the Police will be able to enforce the restrictions and requirements of a PSPO, which can include issuing Fixed Penalty Notices.

The Fixed Penalty Notice for a breach of a PSPO is £60 if paid within 10 days, and £100 if paid within 14 days.

Buckinghamshire Car Parks Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO)

What we are proposing

The Chiltern Car Parks PSPO was introduced on 2 May 2018, by Chiltern District Council, to address anti-social behaviour in the public place. The PSPO expires on 20 February 2026.

- Chiltern Car Parks PSPO extension 2023

We are proposing to:

- expire the Chiltern Car Parks Public Spaces Protection Order
- introduce a new Public Space Protection Order for Car Parks in Buckinghamshire

We have engaged with local stakeholders, community boards, town and parish councils, Thames Valley Police, Council services, and members of the business community to develop the proposed PSPO.

The proposed PSPO will prohibit the following activities associated with antisocial behaviours:

- using a mechanically propelled vehicle in a way that causes or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress
- using any part of the restricted area for skating, skateboarding, cycling, or ball games in a way that causes or is likely to cause nuisance or annoyance

It is proposed the PSPO be implemented in the following locations:

- Chiltern Avenue Car Park, Chiltern Avenue, Amersham-on-the-Hill, HP6 5 AH
- Civic Centre Car Park, King George V Road, Amersham-on-the-Hill, HP65AW
- Council Offices Car Park, King George V Road, Amersham HP6 5AW
- Sycamore Road Car Park, Rickmansworth Road, Amersham, HP6 5EQ
- Amersham Old Town Car Park, The Broadway, Amersham Old Town, HP7 OHL
- Watermeadow Car Park, Weylands Court, Germain Street, Chesham, HP5 ILF
- Star Yard Car Park, Blucher Street, Chesham, HP5 IDS
- Catlins Car Park, Blucher Street, Chesham, HP5 IDS
- Albany Car Park, St Marys Way, Chesham, HP5 ILL

We are proposing to introduce the PSPO to prevent:

- occurrence or re-occurrence of the anti-social behaviour identified in the Order
- an increase in the frequency or seriousness of the anti-social behaviour identified in the Order

By taking part in the survey, you have the opportunity to identify other types of anti-social behaviour that you think should be included in the PSPO.
