Overview

Winslow Conservation Area exists to preserve and enhance the town's heritage. We want to hear your views on reductions and additions we're proposing to make to the conservation area boundaries.

Winslow Conservation Area review

We have now completed a review of the Winslow Conservation Area. Based on the findings of the review we are proposing two reductions and two additions to the conservation area boundary. We would like to hear the views of people who live locally or have an interest in the town on these proposed changes.

We'd also like to hear your general comments on the other proposed changes to the conservation area appraisal and management plan

What a conservation area is

A conservation area is defined in law as 'an area of special architectural or historic interest, the character of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance'.

As the local planning authority, it is our responsibility to identify places of special architectural of historical interest in our towns and villages, and to designate them as conservation areas. We also have a responsibility to review these conservation areas from time to time to determine whether any further parts of the local area should be included, or existing parts excluded. Most of our duties regarding conservation areas are set out in the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 (Gov.UK).

Designation of a conservation area recognises the unique quality of the heritage of that area as a whole. This quality comes not only from individual buildings but also other features, including (but not limited to) topography, materials, thoroughfares, street furniture, open spaces and landscaping. These all contribute to the historic character and appearance of an area, resulting in a distinctive local identity and sense of place.

The features of special interest of a conservation area are set out in a document known as a conservation area appraisal. This is used to inform the overall management of the area as well as individual planning decisions within it. It also acts as a reference document that engages the local community and visitors with the history and heritage of that place.

Proposed changes to the Winslow Conservation Area

The new review of Winslow Conservation Area sets out the background to Winslow's historical development and looks in detail at how this heritage is reflected in the town as we know it today. Our review proposes two reductions to the conservation area due to redevelopment that has taken place since the previous review was completed in 2008. It also proposes two additions to the conservation area which seek to preserve and enhance further parts of the town that merit heritage recognition.

The four boundary changes are listed below, and we'd like your opinions on them. Please respond to us on as many or as few as you wish.

We'd also like to hear your general comments on the revised appraisal and management plan.

- 1. Proposed reduction of the conservation area: Claremont Close
- 2. Proposed reduction of the conservation area: the former Old Vicarage and Old Rectory Close

1. Proposed reduction of the conservation area: Claremont Close

Claremont Close is a recently-developed cul-de-sac to the north of Station Road. It was constructed on land adjoining Northolme, 23 Station Road, after outbuildings related to that house were demolished in 2016.

The review considered that the new development is of limited historic and architectural interest and has therefore proposed that the area is removed from the conservation area.

2. Proposed reduction of the conservation area: the former Old Vicarage and Old Rectory Close
It is proposed to remove the redeveloped Old Vicarage and Old Rectory Close area located to the west of the cemetery and northwest of Church Walk from the Winslow Conservation Area.
The former Old Vicarage was a large brick-built house constructed in the mid- late nineteenth century but was demolished circa 2010, after the previous conservation area review was completed in 2008. It has been replaced with a modern residential development. The replacement buildings are of limited architectural interest and although the site has some historic interest as the site of the former vicarage this is also limited.
The loss of the historic building has undermined the contribution the site makes to the character and appearance of the conservation area. The historic boundary wall has been retained, which is visible from Parson Close and the footpath that connects Horn Street to Vicarage Road. Whilst historic, it may present management challenges if left within the conservation area boundary It could be considered as a candidate for the local heritage list.

3. Proposed addition to the conservation area: parts of Park Road and Avenue Road

It is proposed to include the west side of Park Road as well as Avenue Road (Numbers 3-17, 21-37 20-38 and Norden House) within the Conservation Area.

Park Road was laid out in the late nineteenth to early twentieth century and Avenue Road was laid out in the late nineteenth century and contains Norden House, a Grade II listed building.

Both roads have good examples of late nineteenth and early twentieth century residential properties. The properties are consistent in their form, scale, appearance and boundaries; together they present an attractive and cohesive group.

Their character has been well-preserved with many retaining their traditional timber windows and doors and original materials. There are examples of unsympathetic alterations such as uPVC windows and doors, front facing rooflights and material changes but they are not widespread. Inclusion within the conservation area would help manage future change to ensure their special interest is preserved.

It was constructed in the early twentieth century. The property has been altered including a replacement roof and replacement chimneys. However, the property has retained its character and is representative of Winslow's expansion following the development of the railway.
