

- The Wycombe Local Plan has a target of 10,925 homes up to 2033
- The Princes Risborough Expansion Area (PREA) is allocated for circa 2500 homes




## Background

- New Homes and Supporting infrastructure includes two new primary schools, open spaces, a local centre and a relief road
- This relief road will provide access, and 'a complete alternative' to the A4010 with the aim to improve traffic conditions in the town
- Improved connections to the station and the town with a new bus service, an underpass and walking & cycling improvements





- Princes Risborough Expansion SPD March 2021 sets out the Council's preferred approach to delivery
- Each phase of housing depends on infrastructure capacity being available to support it and to unlock the next phase of housing
- The project we are presenting today, the SRL, is Phase one of the relief road, led by Buckinghamshire Council
- Note Phasing and timetable is indicative



#### Key Benefits of the Southern Road Link



- First stage of the relief road for Princes Risborough to be the main route for north-south traffic
- New access to the expansion area
- Removes pinch point at railway bridge.
- Alignment of the road minimises impact on frontagers as far as possible
- Improved provision for walking and cycling through new footways/cycleways
- Enhanced flood capacity and resilience for local residents and businesses
- Wildflower and tree planting to enhance biodiversity in the area

## Funding

- Developers are required to fund the expansion including infrastructure
- Buckinghamshire Council has secured £12M of funding from Homes England to cashflow the PRSRL and to accelerate delivery of the expansion.

#### Purpose of Consultation

- Over the past year the project team have developed our concept, and tried to resolve many of the key problems
- We have developed our design to a point we now want feedback to help shape it and make it even better.
- To present our current proposal, and gain feedback. This will support a future planning application.
- To talk with residents and businesses that may be directly affected.

## Progress to Date

- 1. Preliminary Design completed
- 2. Optioneering work undertaken to minimise impacts on residents.
- 3. Design updated to account for climate change events.
- 4. Surveys, including utilities, topographical, ecological have been completed.
- 5. Further surveys to be completed in 2022.
- 6. Picts Lane/Shootacre Lane investigated and descoped.
- 7. Some initial negotiations with regards to land acquisition




## Scheme Summary 1

- 1. New Junction Arrangement to future Phases
- 2. New railway bridge built west of the old bridge with increased headroom.
- 3. Summerleys Road will be realigned further to the west to pass under the new bridge.
- 4. The old bridge and highway will be retained, and become a new cycleway/pedestrian route, and maintain property access.
- 5. Summerleys road will be lowered on approach to the new bridge.



## **Bridge Layout**



- Following optioneering we propose to move the highway alignment west with a new rail underbridge. Creation of residents only access road.
- Aiming to reduce impacts on properties along of Summerleys Road
- Expected maximum changes to some property accesses is approx. 1 metre height difference with new road levels.

## Scheme Summary 2

- 1. Station Road Junction will be upgraded to 4 way traffic lights.
- 2. We are connecting Picts Lane to Station Road by way of a new link road via the new junction.
- 3. New flood attenuation pond/storage, culverts, and tree/meadow planting for the alignment with screening.
- 4. Old Picts Lane stopped up to through traffic and become a Cul-De-Sac. Cycle and pedestrian access only.



## **Other Points:**

- Width of carriageway to be 6.5m through phase 1
- 30mph speed limit
- 3m width shared footway/cycleways, linking the north and south of the scheme.
- Summerleys road is expected to be closed to through traffic during construction. During which access for residents and businesses will be maintained.


