

South East Aylesbury Link Road (SEALR) Phase 2



Overview

Phase 2 of the South East Aylesbury Link Road (SEALR) forms a key part of the Aylesbury Orbital Link Road. This section of road is a proposed addition to the original SEALR Phase 1 works (1.2 kilometres between the A413 Wendover Road and the B4443 Lower Road).

Details

Phase 2 involves the construction of approximately 450 metres of dual carriageway from the future Lower Road roundabout westwards. At the western end of Phase 2, we will construct a new roundabout. This will connect to future road links such as the Stoke Mandeville Relief Road and the South West Aylesbury Link Road (SWALR). Both Phase 1 and Phase 2 would be constructed together as one programme of work.

HS2 Ltd. had planned to construct a single carriageway for this length of road as part of the realigned A4010. However, we have identified this section as a 'pinch-point' that could create significant traffic issues as a single carriageway. Therefore, we have decided to take control of the construction of this additional section in order to make it a dual carriageway with a roundabout.

Benefits



Reduce congestion in Aylesbury by directing traffic around the Aylesbury Orbital Link Road.



Improve walking and cycling by providing two new cycleways/footways.




Provide a key connection on the Aylesbury Orbital Link Road.



Enhance local ecology by achieving a 10% net gain in biodiversity.

Estimated timescale

Depending on the outcome of this consultation and other factors, such as Covid-19 restrictions, this timescale is subject to change.

Design

The SEALR Phase 2 project will provide the following:



Highway

- 450 metres of dual carriageway.
- A new roundabout connecting the SEALR, SWALR and A4010 realignment.



Flood and drainage

 Sustainable drainage solutions to prevent flooding of the road.




Walking and cycling

- A new cycleway/footway linking into the route provided by SEALR Phase 1.
- A second new cycleway/ footway linking into the Mandeville Park development.



Landscape, noise and ecology

- A noise/visual earthwork grass embankment on the northern side.
- 10% net gain in biodiversity and a mammal pass under the road.



Key

- 1. Native hedgerows.
- 2. Linear belt of trees and shrubs.
- 3. Individual trees across the area.
 - 4. Re-aligned public right of way.
- 5. Proposed 3m wide footway/cycleway.
- 6. Landscaped embankment for noise mitigation and screening 7. 2m maintenance track.
 - 8. Uncontrolled pedestrian crossing.
 - 9. Drainage features.
