We want your nominations for the best examples of good design in Buckinghamshire from the last 4 years.

Buckinghamshire residents deserve great places to live and work as well as a healthy environment everyone can enjoy. Good design can help deliver this.

The Buckinghamshire Design Awards celebrate the best examples of good design in the county. They aim to raise the standards for future built development and land management in Buckinghamshire.

Any new development in Buckinghamshire that has been built / converted / restored in the last 4 years can be nominated for an award. It must be something that has been completed.

Anyone can nominate a new development for an award and you can nominate more than one example of good design. We just need to know:

- where it is,
- what it is, and
- why you like it

The first round of nominations was open between July and September 2022.

We are now opening a new round of nominations for the Design Awards. All previous nominations will automatically be considered.

What do we mean by "good design"

Good design means that something is fit for purpose, durable and brings delight.

Well-designed places successfully integrate buildings, landscapes, and infrastructure to serve a wide range of uses, activities and people.

These places may endure and evolve over time. Their 'delight' is not just visual but may also sound, smell and feel great.

Sustainability also lies at the heart of good design. Building great places to live and work means including nature too.

Award categories

The award categories for the Design Awards 2022 to 2023 are:

- public spaces
- historic places
- unique buildings
- new communities
- travel and transport
- climate change and nature

If the type of project you are nominating or submitting is not listed here, choose one or more categories that seem the best fit.

Awards will be made on merit and may not be awarded in every category. This will be decided by an independent judging panel.

To help with your nomination, we've included some examples of the types of projects for each category:

historic places

- new life for old buildings
