SUMMARY

A statutory consultation took place in Amersham between 19 June and 17 July 2020 to formalise the parking controls. These parking controls have been decided upon based on the feedback we received from residents and local people in the informal consultations.

A total of 37 roads were included in the statutory consultation and there were 368 Responses via citizen space, email and letter.

Only the houses which are 'directly affected' by the proposals, meaning that there was a proposal directly outside of their house, would have received a letter as there were not enough resources to deliver to the whole of Amersham. However, all of the necessary information can be found online and street notices were placed on lamp posts on every road affected.

Each road is broken down into different stakeholders who left feedback in the statutory consultation, these are grouped as 'residents', 'others' and if applicable, 'businesses/stakeholder groups'.

Residents – This refers to people who live on the affected road.

Others – This refers to people who do not live on the affected road, however they may use the road, have family who live on the road, or use a business on the road.

Businesses/stakeholder groups – This refers to businesses, groups or councillors/councils who have commented but they may not necessarily own a premises on the affected road. For example; they could be a Parish or Town Council, community group, school or other type of business/charity.

Any additional parking controls will be forwarded to the community boards for future consideration.

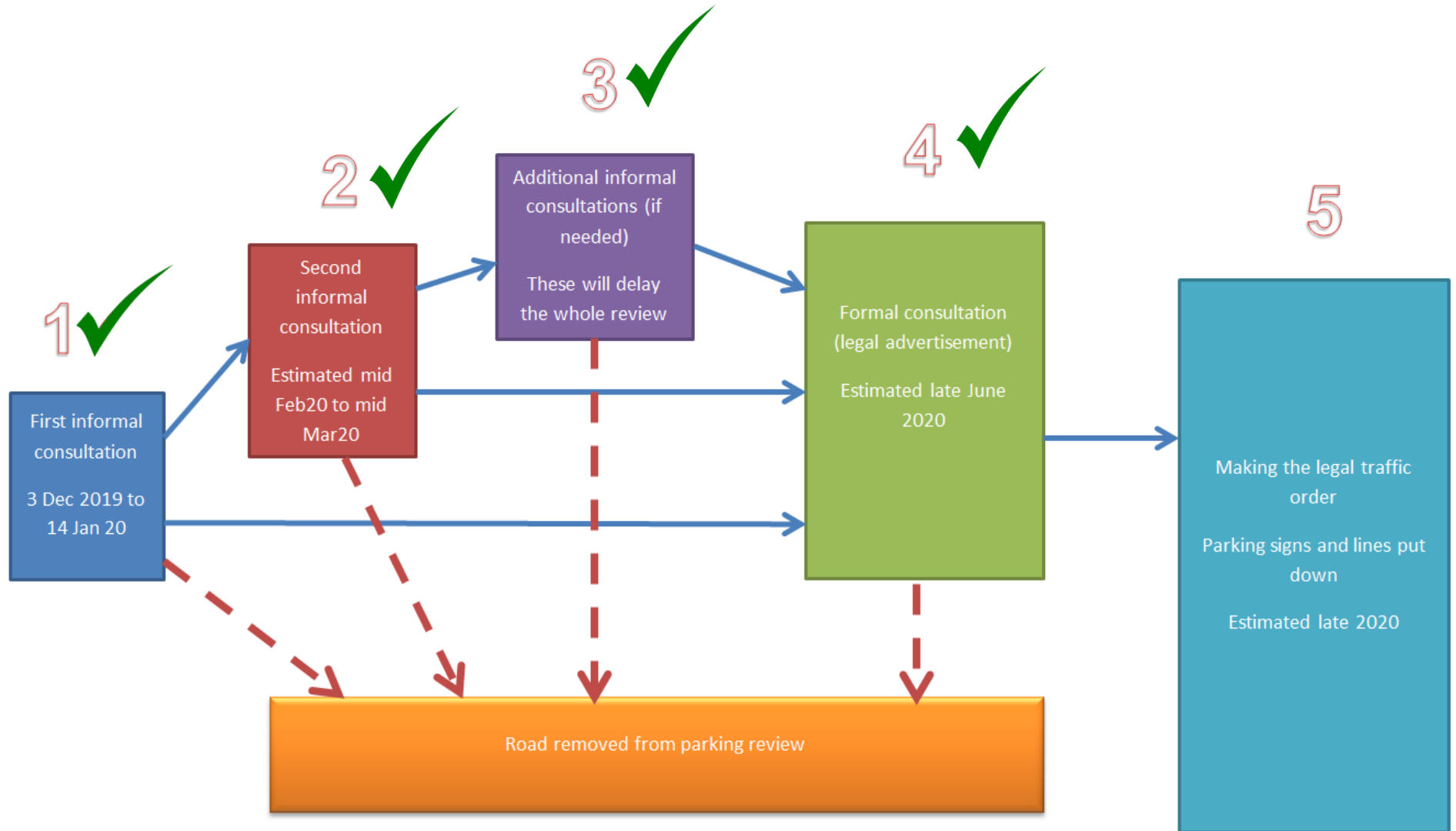

There was overwhelming support in the first and second informal consultation for a single yellow line (Mon-Fri 11am-12noon) due to a large amount of commuter parking. It was also raised that the bus unable to stop and drop off in the appropriate place. A few people commented that the single yellow line near to the junction of Stanley Hill Avenue should be a double yellow line. However, at this stage we are unable to increase the extent, we can only remove or reduce parking controls. Therefore the decision is to proceed with what was advertised which is the maximum of single yellow lines (Mon-Fri 11am-12noon) on Acres End and a bus stop clearway. However, we will forward the comments about double yellow lines instead of single yellow lines, on to the community board for future consideration.
