Decision: Approval to proceed to Statutory Consultation for a

permanent Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) for a 30mph speed limit within the new Arabella Homes

development in Little Kimble.

**Reason for decision:** "[For] facilitating the passage on the road or any

other road of any class of traffic (including

pedestrians).

#### 1. Background

- 1.1 Arabella Park is a new development currently under construction in Little Kimble with around 45 residential properties. The site is bordered by Kimblewick Road to the west and by B4009 Lower Icknield Way / Grove Lane to the south (Figure 1), the location provides access onto the A4010 Risborough Road, offering routes to Stoke Mandeville and Aylesbury to the North, and the Risboroughs to the south. Bayliss Meadows will be the main road running through the development.
- 1.2 The proposed street lighting arrangement within the development follows a policy

known as 'Dark Skies', resulting in minimal illumination.

- 1.3 Under Section 82 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, there would be insufficient lighting columns to constitute a 'system of street lighting', for Bayliss Meadows to be considered a 'restricted road' with a default 30mph limit.
- 1.4 To achieve this, the following proposal (Table 1) has been put forward:

- 2.1 The Council scheme of delegation is contained within its constitution.

- 3.1 All alternatives considered would also require a Statutory Consultation process.
- 4. Local Councillors & Community Boards consultation & views
- 4.1 Local Members and the Civil Parish for Little Kimble were consulted for their views.
- 4.2 The contact officer has also contacted the Cabinet Member for Transport (as named at the front of this report), along with Thames Valley Police and Buckinghamshire Council's Network Safety Team to brief them on this project.
- 4.3 The contact officer has previously engaged with Local Members for Ridgeway East and Great and Little Kimble cum Marsh Parish Council via emails sent between January and June 2025 (Appendix B).
- 4.4 The Local Members were again consulted on their views via an email sent by the Contact Officer over a 28 day period (expiring on 24<sup>th</sup> August 2025). No responses were received.
