Buckinghamshire Council Chesham ETRO (Traffic Movement) Order 2024

Notice is hereby given that on 18th October 2024, Buckinghamshire Council has made an Experimental Traffic Regulation Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers the effect of which is to introduce / amend the following:

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| The Broadway | Revocation of Pedestrian Zone and replace with <i>Bus and Cycle Lane</i> and <i>One Way</i> . |
| The Broadway (outside No. 75 - Nationwide) | Revocation of Double Yellow Lines and replace with a bay for <i>Loading only 10am – 4pm / No</i> stopping 4pm – 10am Except Taxis |
| The Broadway (entrance to block paved area) | Revocation of Double Yellow Lines |
| Junction of The Broadway and High Street (northern end of One – Way System) | Introduction of No Entry |
| Junction of Market Square and Red Lion StreetHigh Street (between No. 1/2 and No. 51/52)Church Street (between No. 4 High Street and Junction with High Street and Market Square) | Revocation of existing Pedestrian Zone and replace with Pedestrian Zone No Motor Vehicles except Permit Holders and Loading Mon – Tue, Thurs – Fri & Sun 6am – 10am & |
| Market Square (from Church Street / High Street to Red Lion Street) | 4pm – 6pm and Wed & Sat 6am – 10am & 3pm - 6pm |
| Church Street (from its junction with High Street & Market Square in a westerly direction) Market Square (from its junction with High Street in | |
| a southerly direction to Red Lion Street) High Street (Junction with Station Road in a southerly direction to its junction with Market Square) | Revocation of One – Way System |

The Order will be implemented on an experimental basis for up to eighteen months.

if the order is varied by a subsequent order or modified pursuant to section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 from the date that variation order or modification comes into force.
