Second Consultation for the introduction and amendments of Parking and Moving Restrictions within Chesham Town Centre through Experimental Traffic Regulation Orders (ETROs)

Buckinghamshire Highways have completed the experimental amendment to parking and moving restrictions on several roads within Chesham Town Centre via an ETRO. These changes are a result of concerns raised by local businesses and local members. The proposals will allow more flexibility for local businesses whilst also increasing safety for pedestrians. This is the second consultation to be launched, following the previous one in 2024/2025.

What happens next?

We will develop the proposals based on what residents and key stakeholders within the area tell us. If the feedback shows people support the proposed ETROs, we will begin the process of making the ETROs permanent. Should the results show that the ETROs are not supported, we will revert the restrictions to a point prior to the beginning of the Experimental Traffic Regulation Order.
