STATEMENT OF REASONS

Keep Hill Woods – Warren Wood Drive Highway Improvements

It is proposed to introduce a raised table crossing and extend the current Double Yellow Line restriction on Warren Wood Drive, High Wycombe. The proposals can be found in the table below, along with the reasons for these proposals.

Warren Wood Drive (approximately 16 metres west of the junction with Keep Hill Drive and Lime Avenue)	Installation of a 75- millimetre-high raised table.	By authorising the advertisement of the proposal, Buckinghamshire Council (while having regard to the matters specified in Sections 90A, 90C and 90D, respectively, of the Highways Act 1980), has given consideration to its duty under Section 90A(1a) of that Act. The raised table has been proposed to allow cyclists and pedestrians to cross Warren Wood Drive to access public footpaths between new developments and The Rye.
Warren Wood Drive (existing Double Yellow Lines on the southern side of the carriageway, just west of the junction with Keep Hill Drive and Lime Avenue)	Extend existing Double Yellow Lines in a westerly direction by approximately 14.3 metres.	By authorising the advertisement of the proposal, Buckinghamshire Council (while having regard to the matters specified in Section 122 Subsection (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984) has given consideration to its duty under Section 122(1) of that Act as to: <i>"secure the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of vehicular and other traffic (including pedestrians) and the provision of suitable and adequate parking facilities on and off the highway []"</i>
