The Buckinghamshire Council (Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Stopping) and (On-Street Parking Places) Order 2021 (Amendment No *) Order 202*

Notice is hereby given that Buckinghamshire Council proposes to make the above-named Order under Sections 122(1) and 122(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 in relation to the Double Yellow Line extension on Warren Wood Drive, High Wycombe.

In addition, Buckinghamshire Council proposes to install a new raised table crossing on Warren Wood Drive, as specified under Sections 90A, 90C and 90D of the Highways Act 1980.

The proposals are listed in the below table:

Affected Road (And Extents)	Proposals
Warren Wood Drive, High Wycombe (approximately 16 metres west of the junction with Keep Hill Road and Lime Avenue)	Installation of a 75-millimetre-high raised table.
Warren Wood Drive, High Wycombe (Just west of the junction with Keep Hill Road and Lime Avenue, on the southern side of the carriageway)	Extend existing Double Yellow Lines in a westerly direction by approximately 14.3 metres.

A copy of the Order and Plan showing the length of road affected, together with a copy of the Council's Statement of Reasons for proposing to install the raised table and to make the Order may be inspected Monday to Friday between 9am and 5pm at Buckinghamshire Council, Council Access Plus, Walton Street, Aylesbury, HP20 1UA, United Kingdom.
