

The Buckinghamshire Council

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on the 20th May 2022 Buckinghamshire Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”), in exercise of its powers under sections 1, 2, 4, 45 and 46 and Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (“the 1984 Act”) as amended and under the Traffic Management Act 2004 (“the Act of 2004”) as amended and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act of 1984, proposes to make the following Orders.

- **The Buckinghamshire Council (Prohibition of Loading, Waiting and Stopping) and (On-Street Parking Places) Order 2021 (Amendment No. 002) Order 2022.**
- **The Buckinghamshire Council (Speed Limit) Order 2021 (Amendment No. 003) Order 2022.**
- **The Buckinghamshire Council (Traffic Movement) Order 2021 (Amendment No. 004) Order 2022.**

The effect of these Orders is to introduce or amend parking restrictions, parking permits, Speed Limits and restrict traffic movement in various areas throughout the Buckinghamshire Council Highway Network.

A copy of the Orders and Plans showing the lengths of road affected, together with a copy of the Council’s Statement of Reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected during normal office hours at “The Gateway, Gatehouse Road, Aylesbury, HP19 8FF”.

If you wish to question the validity of these Orders, or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of this Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to these Orders, you may within six weeks from 20th May 2022, by applying to the High Court.
