Dear Residents and Business owners,

Statutory Consultation for the introduction of raised crossings and amendment of parking restrictions at A4154 Woodside Road, Amersham.

Buckinghamshire Highways is proposing to introduce a controlled raised zebra crossing near 191 Stockbridge Woodside Road, an uncontrolled raised crossing across Plantation Road at its junction and amend the existing zebra crossing outside number 88 to a controlled raised zebra crossing at Woodside Road. Also, amendment of parking restrictions at A4154 Woodside Road and Plantation Road junction with Woodside Road. These measures are to enhance pedestrian safety and reduce collision risks.
