Roughwood Lane, Chalfont St Giles – prohibition to motorised traffic

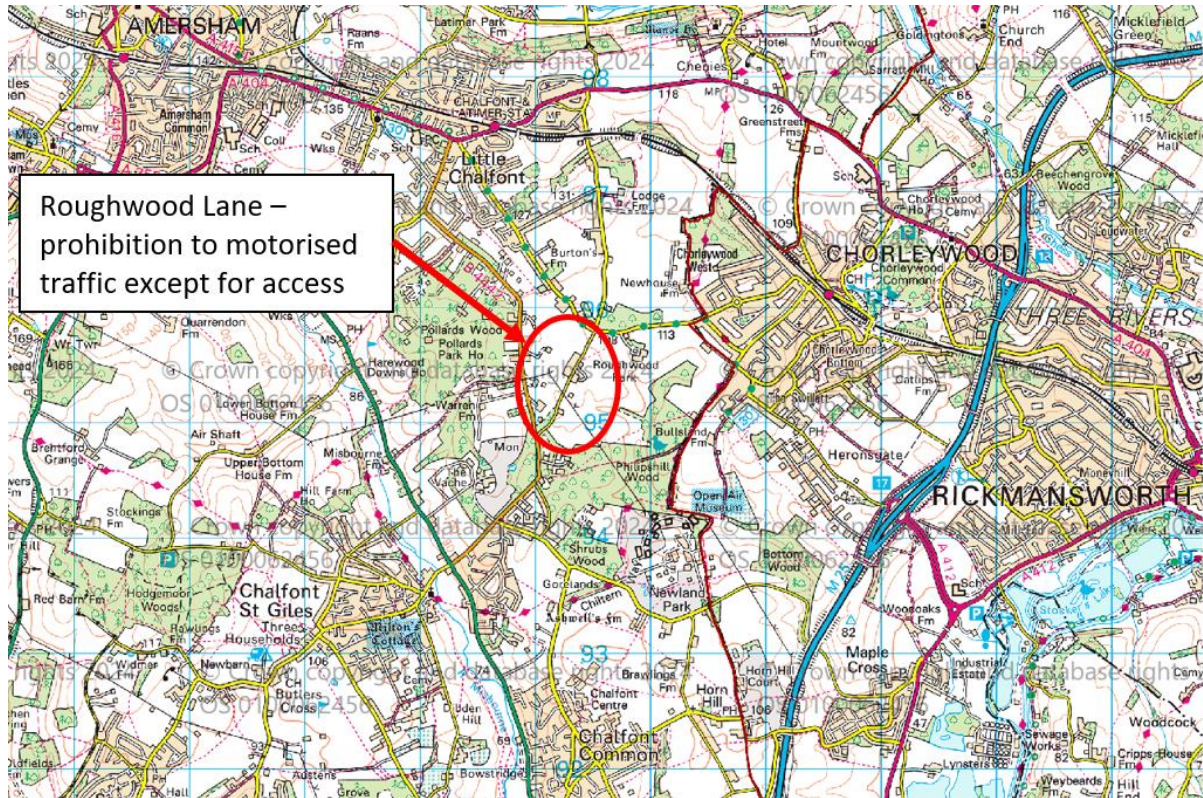


Figure 1 - Map showing location of Roughwood Lane, Chalfont St Giles - Crown Copyright OS0100062456
